GROUP A ENGL151310 Studies in Popular Fiction GLBTQ + Literature & Culture Professor Brandy Yates TWR 1:00 – 4:00 PM

This course will explore fiction by popular LGBTQIAP authors as well as examine the presences of LGBTQIAP people in popular culture. We will read short stories and nontraditional form short fiction from both classic and contemporary from Virginia Wolf to Dorothy Allison, from Dale Peck to Roxanne Gay. We will identify trends and discuss representations of asexual people in comedic sitcoms and transgender people in dramas as well as explore drag culture and reality TV.
